Grand Opening of Mountain Bike Trails Kicks Off Cedarburg Trails Day

The Town of Cedarburg is hosting the fourth annual Cedarburg Trails Day at Pleasant Valley Park & Trails on Saturday, September 21st from 10am to 2pm. This event also marks the opening of Ozaukee County's first official mountain bike trail, which is made possible through a partnership between the Town and the Ozaukee County Mountain Bike Club. The trails were constructed by the bike club at no cost to Town taxpayers.

This free, family-friendly event is a great opportunity to experience the hidden treasurers within this 88-acre park. In addition to the new mountain bike trails, the park offers walking trails, an elevated boardwalk path, an observation platform, kettles, an open prairie, a bog, and Mole Creek!

The event will feature a small bike trail for kids, games, giveaways, rider skill challenges, and food supplied by the Five Corners Lions Club & Colectivo Coffee.

Pleasant Valley Park & Trails is located at 5100 Pleasant Valley Road just one-half mile east of CTH I.

Although the main event will be at Pleasant Valley Park & Trails, hikers are also encouraged to take advantage of the trails at Krohn Park located just down the road at 7599 Pleasant Valley Road.
