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Town Approves Five Corners Drive Improvements *Project Aims to Implement Five Corners Master Plan*

On August 1st, the Town Board awarded a contract for the extension of Five Corners Drive and installation of sidewalks and decorative lighting. Five Corners Drive, which is located on the south side of STH 60 just west of the Five Corners intersection, currently serves the Commons at Five Corners lifestyle center and the Grafton State Bank. T.P. Concrete was awarded the contract totaling \$116,447.

“This is a major step in our effort to develop the Five Corners area into a vibrant and pedestrian-friendly Town Center,” explained Town Chairman Dave Valentine.

The Five Corners Drive project will extend the asphalt roadway approximately 250 feet south from the rear of the lifestyle center and bank to the property line of the five acre parcel purchased by the Town earlier this year. The Town is willing to entertain offers to develop this five acre property which abuts the Town Recycling Center.

The Five Corners area has long been the heart of the Town’s commercial activity. In recognition of the important role it plays in the Town, the Five Corners Master Plan was created more than a year ago to guide its development.

In keeping with the pedestrian-friendly elements of the Five Corners Master Plan, sidewalks and decorative lighting are included in this project. Five foot wide concrete sidewalks will be constructed along both sides of Five Corners Drive from the rear of the lifestyle center and bank south to the property line. A sidewalk will also run north along the west side of the road from the rear of the bank to the northern most entrance to the bank. Pedestrian crossings will be installed to provide access to both sides of the road. The decorative lights will begin just south of STH 60 with dual head light fixtures on either side of the entrance to the development. Single head lights will then line Five Corners Drive in a staggered manner. A sidewalk will also be constructed to provide pedestrian access north of lifestyle center parking lot and then east along the top of a berm in front of STH 60 to the PDQ gas station.
